

eing the cradle of modern polo, India has always had a special relationship with the game.

Amongst the first and most popular Indian states or communities to play, cherish and patronise modern polo were the Rajputs (Rajputana kingdoms) and Sikhs. Besides being extraordinary horsemen, members belonging to these teams were noted for their exceptional stick work and horse controlling skills.

Prior to and during the British rule in India, most of Rajasthan comprised Rajput kingdoms. The area was known as Rajputana where the game of polo flourished under patronage of the royals.

While miniature paintings at the Mehrangarh Museum reveal that the Rathores first played polo with the Mughals, it was not until the 19th century that polo was formally introduced into the region. In 1889, Sir Pratap, younger brother of the then Maharaja and Prime Minister of Jodhpur State, invited Col Stuart Beatson of the Bengal Lancers to help him raise the Jodhpur Lancers. Four years later, the Jodhpur Team brought home its first trophy, The Rajputana Challenge Cup of 1893. The team, under the captainship of Sir Pratap, included Beatson, Harji (Thakur Hari Singh, the great horseman), and Thakur Dhonkal Singh. It continued to shine in the field of polo in the

The emergence of polo in Jaipur eventually led to the formation of the famous Jaipur team and gave Indian modern polo some of its finest moments.

succeeding years and bagged laurels, locally and internationally. All four players rank among the best polo players in the history of India. Under Sir Pratap's leadership, the team visited London for Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee, being amongst the first Indian teams to travel abroad, and, for that matter, among the few foreign teams to enter England. They won matches there, at Hurlingham and Ranelagh and came back with an enhanced reputation, recognised as one of the most eminent teams of all time.

olo, a spectator sport patronized by the aristocracy, is also famous for picnics on lush green fields. This tradition was set in ancient times, but is seen in contemporary Polo too. The history of picnics is described interestingly in a recent narrative by Alexander Lee. The word is speculated to be an amalgam of the French words piquer (to pick/peck) and nique (at a small amount/nothing). It was first used within the high-brow satire in 1649 to depict the hypocrisy of the French Revolution where a character named Pique-Nique was the gluttonous protagonist who rebelled against the French monarchy.

# PICNICS AND POLO: A PERFECT HARMONY

In the Victorian Era, it was imperative that England's upper class eat food outside with tables, linens, crystals and servants. As the general public aspired to the high life, picnics became a gourmet affair (Source: National Public Radio). Multiple Telly Award winner, owner of JMFdeA Press and author of Sassy Food, Ja-ne de Abreu states polo made its way to the United States during 1876 due to its renown as a cavalry training sport. The first match in Hawaii was played in 1880. King David Kalakaua turned the Kapiolani Park into a polo field and picnics became common for

spectators as a way to refresh themselves. Polo in Dubai took root in the 1980s, almost a decade after the formation of the UAE as an extension of the desert Arabic culture. This bedouin lifestyle was always about community and tribal spirit, which percolated well into the polo games. In Africa, polo picnics maintained the same air of exquisite luxury. A BBC historical account notes that eating under the tree was a form of recess during the hunting, shepherding and exploration phase of mankind and thus they ate such meals even before the term "picnics" was invented. Unsurprisingly, polo as a blend of hunting and horsemanship, sans violence, made picnics an easy, postgame affair.

# POLO AND PICNICS AROUND THE WORLD

Ja-ne de Abreu observes that polo has been one of the bonds between India and Hawaii. The well-established Paniolo (cowboy) culture of Hawaii led to an influx of skilled horse riders and horses, and polo became an instant favourite. Ja-ne states a nice picnic practice at the Hawaiian Polo Club called The Picnic: "Every year, for the last match of the season, everyone brings an unwrapped gift for an underprivileged child to be wrapped and placed under the Christmas Tree." Along with the sweet gesture, polo picnics in Hawaii have transitioned over the years to offer a myriad of options such as DIYs, takeaways from local restaurants/ sandwich shops or elegant baskets crafted by chefs who provide a personalized touch. Over the years, polo picnics have become more easygoing. Polo picnic menus are now a standardized array revolving around a charcuterie board of opulent cheeses and fruit, or British-style neat sandwiches commonly found at Royal Ascot games.

1rom just being a leisure activity of the rich and the elite, horse racing has developed into a fullfledged public entertainment business. This equestrian performance sport has witnessed changes in equipment, returns involved and scale while the basic concept has remained the same over time.

Best known for their use in horse racing, thoroughbreds are "hotblooded" horses, known for their agility, speed and spirit. They are widely used for riding activities such as show jumping, combined training, dressage, polo, and fox hunting. They are often crossbred in order to develop new breeds as well as improve the existing ones. As this breed is involved in high intensity sports, exertion is a common phenomenon amongst them. This eventually leads to high accident rates and health issues such as bleeding from the lungs, low fertility, abnormally small hearts, and a small hoof-to-body-mass ratio.

#### STALLION FERTILITY

Extensive studies have been conducted to research and analyse the rationale behind increasing health problems in the thoroughbred breed. One such study conducted by The University of Newcastle's equine fertility research group has led to the development of a low-cost, reliable and hassle-free device that helps thoroughbred stallion owners to examine stallion fertility at the time of breeding. Codeveloped with support from AgriFutures Australia, the device provides valuable information about indicators of fertility like motility, morphology and sperm count. Additionally, it gives a heads up about a stallion's sperm metabolic rate. Dr Zamira Gibb, lead researcher of the study, stated that "uniquely in horses, this is the most important predictor of a successful pregnancy. Metabolism is not only important for motility, but also to facilitate the energyThoroughbreds are

has inspired stud masters to increase the breeding rate of their stallions. As only natural breeding is permitted, success becomes imperative, or else the mares require re-serving, which ultimately results in a financial loss for studs along with additional travel. Therefore, they are keen for their top stallions to serve as many mares as possible during the breeding season, lessening the chances of failure of mares getting in foal. Subsequently, it increases the revenue for studs. These requirements ultimately lead to the need for quick, simple, reliable, and





# *JAIPUR POLO SEASON*



#### NOIDA POLO SEASON

Coming in to take away the post-season blues was the Noida Polo Season 2021. The season commenced with the 8-goal Jindal Polo Cup which was a four-day tournament among two pools of two teams, on September 28. The first match was played by Jindal Panther and Clairmont wherein Clairmont started with an advantage of 2.5 goals. Moreover, Bhavani Kalwi and Angad Singh scored 2 goals, yet the teamwork of Jindal Panther stood strong. Simran Singh Shergill scored 3 goals while the team hustled to get to 8-4.5, thus winning the first game.

The second match was a battle between Riverside Polo and Sahara Warriors. Riverside started off with a 0.5 advantage. Nonetheless, Sahara Warriors put forth such tactful teamwork that restricted Riverside Polo to score further goals. Daniel Otamendi, Angad Kalaan, LN'k Ravindra Mang and Sep Mukesh Gurjar put out tremendous performances to

reach 7-0.5 by the half-time of the fourth chukker. Through mutual consensus, the game was called off with their victory.


