Coming Together For Horses

"The industry needs the Horseracing Integrity Act," said Shawn Smeallie, executive director of the Coalition of Horse Racing Integrity. "While various tracks and organizations have announced reforms addressing horse injuries, the industry still suffers from a lack of a national system to regulate itself. Passage of the HIA solves that."

The HIA is a horse-first bill that would create a private, independent national horse racing anti-doping authority responsible for developing and administering a strict anti-doping and medication control program.

The effort to bring uniform standards to protect racehorses passed three major milestones this week. One hundred and fifty Members of Congress have signed on as co-sponsors to the Horseracing Integrity Act (HIA), which is more than one third of the House of Representatives. Besides the strong Congressional support, 135 of the industry's leading trainers support the bill. Additionally, more than 53,000 people have signed a petition from the Coalition for Horse Racing Integrity (CHRI) calling for passage of the bill.



Ireland At Olympics

Longines FEI Nations' Cup

Ireland will have a show jumping team at the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo after winning the Longines FEI Nations' Cup final in Barcelona this weekend. The Rodrigo Pessoa-managed team of Darragh Kenny (Balou du Reventon), Peter Moloney (Chianti's Champion), Cian O'Connor (PSG Final) and Paul O'Shea (Skara Glen's Machu Picchu) claimed the sole Olympic team place on offer when finishing on a score of one as Belgium, the recently crowned European champions, finished second on four faults. Belgium finished ahead of Sweden in third, Italy in fourth and France in fifth place while Germany, Switzerland and Colombia completed the eightnation line-up.

Ireland's last show jumping team to compete at an Olympics was at Athens in 2004 and this qualification means that, for the first time, Ireland will have equestrian teams at the 2020 Olympics in eventing, dressage and show jumping.

Encompassing their motto of Accessible Luxury, Frederique Constant has shaken the establishment of Swiss luxury brands, offering high horology and luxury quality watches at accessible pricing. The finest materials and watchmaking fuses to create luxurious men's and ladies watches, including precious stones, manufacture movements and Swiss Made quality made in Geneva.

The company was founded in 1988 by Aletta Francoise Frédérique Stas-Bax and Peter Constant Stas. Its name is derived from the names of great-grandparents of each founder, specifically Frédérique Schreiner (1881–1969) and Constant Stas (1880–1967), the latter of which founded a company producing watch dials in 1904.

In 2002, to diversify the Frédérique Constant group, Stas and his wife acquired Alpina Watches, a manufacturer of Swiss sports watches founded in 1883.

Frederique Constant has grown into one of the larger Swiss watch manufacturers. In 2011, production reached over 120,000 watches, sold in over 2,700 points of sale in more than 100 countries. Frederique Constant positions itself in the accessible luxury segment, with most of its watches selling in the price range of CHF 1,000–5,000 retail. In 2011, the company said that it expected to continue growing at an annual rate of 25%, doubling in size every three years.

In May 2016, Citizen announced its intention to acquire Frederique Constant Holding SA, which includes Frederique Constant, Alpina Watches, and Ateliers deMonaco.

What's In The Cowboy Heels?

Dating back to the bygone era getting the foot stuck in the stirrups while falling down the horse in an upside down position can be a perilous affair for the horse riders and the cavalrymen. Hence in order to evade this situation a bespoke shoe was invented having a high shaft and a significant high sole or a high heel breast. The heel breast proffered the rider a subtle amount of support for sticking his feet to the stirrups of the modern day saddle. In a situation where in the horse starts galloping hither and thither, the rider can



maintain his seat and poise by sticking his body to the stirrups and the saddle. Unlike the cowboy boots a normal boot can increase the probability of suspending and dangling along the running horse in an upside down position, which can be a bizarre site but is a life threatening affair. Hence, it is always recommended by the horse clubs to carry a pair of cowboy boots or a proper style boots.
